Sub: - MEPMA (IKP-Urban) - Community Health - To conduct “Integrated Health Camps” (IHCs) at slum level of all ULBs – Convergence with Health line department, Private Corporate Hospitals and Service Providers – Issue of budget along with certain guidelines – Reg.

ORDER:

As per the reference 4th read above under Action Plan 2013-14 of MEPMA, it is proposed to conduct Integrated Health Camps (IHCs) at Slum Level in all ULBs including Mission Cities. The following is the concept: -

Concept :- Integrated Health Camps (IHCs) - MEPMA proposed to organize an Integrated Health Camps (IHCs) across the districts including Mission Cities in association with Public Health line Departments or Corporate Hospitals or Service Providers (NGOs). The main purpose for organizing these health camps have to conduct with the Doctors of different discipline for health check-up, treatment and generation of health awareness among the slum dwellers.

1. Objective :-

- To take health care to the un-reached areas of slums in the urban areas especially in un-served areas.
- To provide specialized facilities and services such as antenatal check-ups, pediatric care or other multiple disciplines on epidemic diseases to that particular municipality and providing minimum diagnostic test on blood picture, Diabetes, Hypertension, etc, which are otherwise unavailable to them due to non approachability transport, long distances etc.

2. Goal- Main idea behind this, IHCs is to achieve the mandated goal “promotion of healthy life styles” which could not be attain without the betterment of other

Social aspects like women empowerment and easy access of other Health welfare services provided through various line department.

3. Guidelines to conduct of IHC by the **DPMU MEPMA** are as follows :-
- a. **Preparatory meeting** with District officers – DUDA (District Urban Development Authority) meetings: - In Preparatory meeting as part of Health related issues Briefing about MEPMA- community health interventions to District Medical & Health officers (DM&HO) and discuss the scope and need of potential health interventions at slum level, & accessibility of health services at ULB wise.
 - b. **Approval from District Collector:** - Finalization of Date & Schedule of commenced health camps taking approval from District Collector and if possible invite the District collector to inaugurate the camp.
 - c. **Venue:** - depend on current activities with health line department, at ULB wise identification and location of Slums.
 - d. Identification of private health service providers (Corporate Hospitals) to make medical services at free of cost.
 - e. Accessible on current National health programmes, and District health extension outreach programmes like Rajiv Aarogya sri etc.
 - f. Coverage of Area: - 8- 10 wards.
 - g. **Publicity:** - MEPMA staff shall take necessary steps to ensure wide publicity to be given prior to the visit of IHC, so that larger population can get service.
 - h. **Logistics:** - Providing of minimum logistics like Tent, Tea and Snacks Photography, documentation, safe drinking water and H-CRPs resource fees for facilitation of health camps.
 - i. **Invitees:** local MLA / MLC / MP / Chair Person / Mayor / Special Officer should be informed & and be invited to inaugurate the camp and Municipal Commissioner should also be invited to the camp . Project Director, DPMU, MEPMA should personally visit the camp.
 - j. Selection of one Best Health -CRPs from trained Health-CRPs and one SLF-RP for facilitation and documentation of camp. (Documentation: - Health Camp format has to be filled by H-CRPs (Format Enclosed)).
4. **Essential Requirements / Norms to be followed by the Medical Department to conduct IHC.**
- a. IHC will be attended by Medical Officer of the concerned UHC/ PHC/ Area hospital/ District Hospital/ Corporate Hospital along with two or three other Para medical persons (preferably ANM), supervisor and Health Assistant as per availability will accompany to assist medical officer for smooth operation of the camp.
 - b. Medicines/ other Diagnostics Equipments:- essential medicines and if possible required Diagnostics facilities shall be provided to the patients/ beneficiaries attending the camp.
 - c. The IHC shall provide the following services
 - o Services relating to different public Health Programmes.
 - o Antenatal/postnatal Check-ups
 - o Immunization of children including Vitamin-A supplementation.
 - o Prophylaxis and treatment of Anemia with IFA tablets.
 - o IEC and counseling.
 - o Appropriate referral.

5. **Funds:** - Funds for each camp Rs. 6000/- @ one Health camp per ULB, for maintaining above logistics including Resource person (RP) fee – (Health-CRP-RS-250/- and SLF-RP Rs-250/-facilitation, documentation and follow up cases).
6. **Budget:** - Budget norms for conducting Health camps for approximately 300 members.

After utilizing it the UC may be sent.
