Orientation of Master Trainers on Menstrual Hygiene Management (MHM)

Context

Today, millions of women and girls around the world are stigmatized, excluded and discriminated, simply because they menstruate. Menstrual Hygiene Management (MHM) is not only a sanitation matter, but also an important step towards safeguarding the dignity, bodily integrity and overall life opportunities of women and girls. Considering the low level of awareness, unhygienic practices, and silence over MHM, the Government of India has included MHM in many national policies and guidelines implementing various programmes through frontline health workers. Despite these government initiatives, there is limited improvement in adolescents' MHM knowledge and practices.

UNICEF has, therefore, been extending technical support to the national and state governments to catalyze progress. For instance, UNICEF has facilitated formation of a multi-departmental MHM committee to steer the process, in AP and Karnataka; and process in on to form the committee in Telanagana. The MHM committees during their meetings felt that training and development of Master Trainers is essential step for progressive realization of MHM. Recognising this, UNICEF proposed an orientation program for Master Trainers on MHM, in collaboration with the state governments of Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka and Telangana on 17th December 2022 in virtual mode.
