1. Preamble

The rapid pace of urbanization has brought in challenges for ensuring a clean environment. It is well known that poor sanitation leads to significant health costs and untreated sewage from cities is the single biggest source of water pollution in India. In this context, the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan is being implemented by the Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs (MoHUA) and the Ministry of Drinking Water and Sanitation (MoDWS) for urban and rural areas respectively.

Community Based Organisations (CBOs), nurtured under Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana-National Urban Livelihoods Mission (DAY-NULM) have participated actively in the clean-up activities and awareness campaigns under the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan. These groups are involved in creating awareness by way of peer group influence towards open defecation free cities. Some of the groups are involved in solid waste management also.

The growing sanitation sector offers growing livelihoods opportunities for CBOs. Many Urban Local Bodies (ULBs) are making noteworthy efforts to engage CBOs in sanitation and solid waste management related works, leading to a sustainable income and dignified source of livelihoods for them.

DAY-NULM Swachhata Excellence Awards have been instituted by MoHUA to recognize the Area Level Federations (ALFs), City Level Federations (CLFs) and ULBs working towards achieving sanitation outcomes with their communities and promoting dignified livelihoods in the sanitation sector.

2. Objectives

The main objectives of Swachhata Excellence Awards are:

- ❑ To bring cleanliness and sanitation, as well as livelihoods in the sanitation sector, to the forefront of social discourse
- ❑ To encourage ULBs, ALFs and CLFs for their initiatives related to elimination of open defecation, eradication of manual scavenging, behavioural change towards healthy sanitation practices, creating awareness about its impact on public health and modern and scientific solid waste management
- ❑ To incentivize ULBs to mainstream informal sanitation workers, improve their income earning capacity and engage community organizations to achieve sanitation and cleanliness outcomes

3. Eligibility and Award Amounts

1. City Swachhata Livelihoods Award for ULBs

The award would recognize ULBs' efforts regarding sanitation related livelihoods. These efforts may include –

- I. Engaging community-based organizations (SHG, ALFs and CLFs) through municipal contracts for sanitation and solid waste management work
- II. Conducting skill training and Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) programs for sanitation workers/ safaikaramcharis
- III. Facilitating access to credit and entrepreneurship development programs for sanitation related enterprises
- IV. Any other innovative approaches to provide dignified livelihoods along the sanitation and solid waste management value chains

II. Swachhata Excellence Awards for Area Level Federations (ALFs)

Swachhata Excellence awards was instituted in FY 2017–18 for ALFs excelling in sanitation related work will continue this year, with modified criteria. The criteria for this year would focus on sanitation service provision models and revenue generating enterprise models demonstrated by ALFs in sanitation related work.

The award is meant for ALFs which have been the driving force for effective sanitation coverage in the respective ULBs. ALFs duly recommended and nominated by the State/UT are eligible to be considered for the award.

The total number of awards and the award amount will be as under. Two entries may be submitted per State/UT for consideration.

The criteria for recommendation and nomination will be as follows:

1. The ALFs must be registered as a society/an association under the relevant law of the State and must have received Revolving Fund under DAY-NULM.
2. The ALFs must have conducted regular meetings and cleanliness must be one of its agenda items in meetings.
3. The ALF must have a sanitation sub-committee.
4. The ALFs must have played a role in spreading the message of cleanliness in their locality with a special focus on adoption of hygienic

practices, toilet construction etc.

5. The ALFs should also have promoted innovative methods/best practices on cleanliness & hygiene (e.g. action for making their locality open defecation free, environment friendly garbage disposal, re-use and recycling of waste water and garbage etc).
6. The ALF must be engaged in a sanitation-based livelihoods activity -
 - a. The ALF must have demonstrated a sanitation related activity as an enterprise with a revenue model

OR

- b. The ALF must have a live contract for sanitation service delivery, from the ULB or any other institutional entity.

III. Swachhata Excellence Awards for City Level Federations (CLFs)

The award for CLFs was instituted in FY 2018-19 is to continue this year, with modified criteria. The award is meant for CLFs which have been the driving force for effective sanitation coverage in the respective ULBs. CLFs duly recommended and nominated by the State/UT are eligible to be considered for the award.

7. Distribution of awards:

The selected ULBs, CLFs and ALFs will receive the award from the MoHUA at a national level function. The date and venue will be communicated to the States/UTs well in advance. The TA/DA expenses for the representatives of the award-winning CLFs/ALFs for maximum 2 persons per CLF/ALF, as per prevalent state rules can be paid by respective States and reimbursement thereof shall be claimed from MoHUA. The selected ULBs will have to bear the TA/DA expenditure of their representatives attending the award function.

8. Usage of the award amount:

The award money will be transferred digitally to the account of the ALF/CLF. Apart from the award money, the selected ALFs/CLFs will also receive mementos and

certification of excellence by MoHUA for their work in the field of sanitation and cleanliness. ULBs may use the award amount for taking up activities related to promoting and upgrading livelihoods in the sanitation sector. CLFs and ALFs should use the award amount for:

1. Revolving Fund to the member SHGs,
2. Vulnerable Fund/aid to SHG or its members,
3. Invest in waste management activities,
4. Invest in other livelihoods activities of SHGs/ ALFs,
5. Any other innovative activity

9. Accounts Maintenance:

The ULB/CLF/ALF will maintain an account of incentive amount received and the purpose for which it is spent. Expenditure of this amount will be monitored by State/ULB.
