Sub: MEPMA – Release of Managerial Support to TLFs in Chittoor, Anantapur, Kurnool, Kadapa & Krishna Districts – Sanctioned - Orders – issued.

ORDER:

It is submitted that EC in its meeting dated 21.4.2012 has approved the proposal for release of Managerial support w.e.f. 1.4.2012 to TLFs in view of ensuring effective Book keeping and meeting process at TLF level and also to enable the CBOs to become financially viable and self-managed.

Objective:

- 1. There are 3.02 lakh SHGs, 9339 SLFs and 211 TLFs formed in the state. SLF RPs are trained and positioned at SLF level for ensuring SHG/SLF strengthening and Town Level Federations are formed for ensuring the following activities at town level:
- 2. Town level federations are the effective institutions of the poor which can render multifarious services to the SLFs and its members. Success of these institutions lies in their effective management.
- 3. Since various activities need to be undertaken by these institutions, it is necessary to provide trained managerial support for proper record keeping and follow up action. This managerial support, when it comes within the community, the skills acquired will get internalized and the same will be useful to the community on sustainable basis. Till these institutions become financially viable and self-managed it is felt desirable to extend managerial support in form of
- a) Training the TLF resource person
- b) Providing grant to TLF to meet the cost of managerial activities.
- 4. The detailed guidelines for selection of TLF RPs and roles and responsibilities were communicated.

5. The following are the salient features of the scheme.

- ➤ MEPMA will provide 100% of the cost of the managerial expenses not exceeding Rs. 42000 /- to TLFs during 1st year.
- ➤ During 2nd year 75% of the cost i.e., Rs 31500/- will be provided as grant and the balance 25% will be borne by the TLFs
- During 3rd year, 50% of the cost i.e., 21000/- per TLF will be provided as grant from the project and 50% would be borne by the TLFs
- During 4th year 25% of the cost i.e., Rs 10500/- will be provided as grant from the project and 75% would be borne by the TLFs
- During 5th year these institutions are expected to become financially self reliant and no financial assistance to be granted and the entire managerial support amount of Rs 3500/- per month to be borne by TLFs.

Now it is proposed to release an amount of Rs. 1862000/- to the TLFs positioned in existing and in New ULBs as per the eligibility.

7. Proposed remuneration to be paid to TLF RP through TLFs:

It is proposed to pay Rs 175/- per day for 20 days in a month i.e., Rs 3500/- per month as remuneration to TLF RP in view of the fixed job chart different from SLF RPs and on the basis of work performance.

8. Fund flow mechanism:

MEPMA releases Rs 42000/- towards 1st year support w.e.f 1.4.2012 to respective PDs and PDs shall ascertain the particulars of TLF RP along with the date of selection, training & working – from TLFs along with the proposal from respective MCs and TPrO/PRP –

Shall release one year remuneration from the date of working, certified by TLF & concerned TPrO/MC.

PD examine the proposals and PD in turn would release the same to TLF duly taking resolution accepting the conditionalities for utilization of managerial support, as was done for SLFs.

PD should draft a circular in Telugu on roles and responsibilities of TLF RP and circulate to all TLFs (OB members) in the district and handover to the president, before release of funds.

Shall release funds directly to TLF, duly taking the approval of the respective District Collectors.

9. MONITORING MECHANISM.

- Managerial support/sustainability support of Rs 42000 i.e., for 1st year will be at the disposal of TLF for first year, towards the remuneration payable to TLF RP on the basis of work-performance reviewed during TLF meetings.
- The activities done by TLF RPs would be reviewed and the amount would be paid through cheque during the meeting of TLF itself, every worth

- TPr.O/PRPs*COs shall facilitate proper utilization of funds for the activities for which fund is sanctioned. TLF shall permit the PRPs/TPrOs for verification of accounts whenever necessary.
- ❖ A consolidated report on the utilization of Managerial support funds by TLFs in the town shall be prepared and sent to Project Director by TPrO/PRP along with monthly reports
- ❖ IB Specialist shall facilitate TLFs for furnishing of the UCs from all TLFs to District Units every month on Managerial support/Sustainability support to TLFs.
- ❖ IB Specialist shall also ensure that they facilitate TLFs for ensuring to pay their contribution in the coming years so as to ensure sustainability of CBOs.

Hence, the Finance Manager, MEPMA is requested to release an amount of Rs. Rs. 18,62,000/- /- (Rupees Eighteen Lakhs Sixty Two Thousand only) in favour of the PDs, Chittoor, Anantapur, Kurnool, Kadapa and Krishna districts as mentioned in the annexure below out of UCDN component of SJSRY. The PDs are requested to ensure that they follow the guidelines for release of managerial support to TLFs and furnish the Utilization certificate for the same immediately.
